What is this place and who is it for?

Trail Shelter (CTS) was designed and built by the Trails and Greenways Committee (T&GC) of the Town of Malabar. Members of the T&GC and other volunteers worked hard to make this structure a quality and worthwhile place to visit when on the local trail system. It was intended for use by all trail users - to provide shelter from sun or rain and to also function as a place to relax and observe local wildlife. Most of the project funding came from Malabar taxpayers over two budget years, with some additional components contributed.

The Cameron Trail Shelter is for the enjoyment of all trail users. It is located within the 100 acre *Richard E. Cameron, Sr. & Volunteers Wilderness Preserve* where alcohol, fires, motorized vehicles, and unpermitted camping are prohibited.

After building the CTS as a 100% volunteer quality effort, the T&GC asks you to please respect and take care of this structure so that you and others can continue to enjoy its use. If the CTS is trashed or destroyed, the funds and/or volunteers may not be there for its repair or replacement.

The CTS was intended to be a solid yet low-tech place – quiet and at peace with nature. Hopefully, how users will behave while at the CTS will keep it from needing remote camera surveillance. If you observe someone causing litter, graffiti, vandalism or any other illegal activity, please report it the Brevard County Sheriff's Office.
